ORANGE COUNTY ENDS LOCAL STATE OF EMERGENCY

ORANGE COUNTY, Va. – Effective Tuesday, August 27, at 12:30 p.m., Orange County is ending the local State of Emergency declared on Wednesday, August 21 in response to the Wilderness Water Treatment Plant incident.

Earlier today, the Virginia Department of Health (VDH) and the Rapidan Service Authority (RSA) lifted the Do Not Drink advisory for Wilderness Water Treatment Plant customers.
