# Virginia Department of Social Services (VDSS) Division of Licensing Programs (DOLP)

# Q. What is the Virginia Department of Social Services (VDSS) Division of Licensing Programs (DOLP)?

- A. The DOLP protects the health, safety, and well-being of vulnerable adults and children served in regulated care settings through comprehensive regulatory oversight and provider services. Licensed and non-licensed-regulated programs include:
  - Programs for adults: assisted living facilities (ALFs) and adult day care centers
  - Programs for children: child day centers, family day homes, voluntarily registered child care, and child care exempt programs; child placing agencies and children's residential facilities; child-caring institutions and independent foster homes

#### Q. What kind of activities does the DOLP conduct?

- A. Staff in the DOLP are responsible for:
  - Issuing licenses and providing training to licensees
  - Conducting monitoring inspections, complaint investigations, and background investigations
  - Suppression of illegal operations and issuing violation notices and sanctions
  - Managing the automated information system
  - Developing regulations and policies
  - Consulting with providers

# Q. Which long-term care facilities for adults does DOLP regulate?

A. The DOLP regulates <u>assisted living facilities</u>, which are defined as non-medical residential settings that provide or coordinate personal and health care services, 24-hour supervision, and assistance for the care of four or more adults who are aged, infirm, or disabled.

# Q. When should assisted living facilities contact the DOLP?

- A. Licensed ALFs should contact their assigned licensing inspector for the following:
  - To renew license
  - To request changes/modifications to licensed capacity or other stipulations to current license.
  - To request technical assistance or discuss compliance issues and related concerns.
  - To report any incident, accident, or condition that has caused harm or poses a threat to the life, health, safety and welfare of one or more residents. This includes reporting any <u>outbreak</u> of disease, as defined by the Virginia Board of Health, by rapid means to the local health director or to the Commissioner of the Virginia Department of Health.

# Q. Who do I contact in DOLP when I have questions, concerns, or something I need to report?

A. The first DOLP contact for licensed ALFs should always be the Licensing Inspector assigned to the facility and/or the Licensing Administrator (supervisor) in the area licensing office.
