Injection Safety

Keep patients safe by always using safe injection practices when preparing and giving injections.

BEFORE THE INJECTION

- 1. Make sure you are in a designated clean area away from potential sources of contamination, e.g., at least 3 feet from sinks or water sources
- 2. Perform hand hygiene
- 3. Carefully read the label and check the vial
 - Single dose or multi-dose
 - a. **NEVER** use single-dose vials on more than one patient
 - b. NEVER bring multi-dose vials used for more than one patient into patient care areas
 - Expiration date and beyond-use date have not passed
 - Free from contamination, leaks, or damage
- 4. Disinfect the vial's rubber top with alcohol and allow to dry before piercing with needle
- 5. NEVER reuse needles or syringes to draw up medication, even when getting doses for the same patient



- 1. Perform hand hygiene before and after giving the injection, even if gloves are worn
- 2. Wear personal protective equipment (PPE) according to standard precautions
 - a. Wear a facemask if placing a catheter or injecting medication into the epidural or subdural space
 - b. Wear gloves if there is anticipated blood or body fluid exposure
- 3. Clean the skin with an antiseptic agent and allow to dry, do not touch, before giving the injection
- 4. NEVER reuse needles or syringes for injection, even on the same patient

AFTER THE INJECTION

- Discard used needles, syringes, and single-dose vials in an appropriate disposal container
- 2. Remove and discard any PPE worn
- 3. Perform hand hygiene
