

Virginia Summary

- Exceeding national targets for 2 of 14 highlighted indicators
- Exceeding national average for 12 of the 14 highlighted indicators
- Below targets and national average for:
 - Treatment initiation for immigrants/refugees
 - Treatment initiation for active TB disease



- Goals are aspirational over the five year period
- Aim for steady progress
- CDC evaluated target methodology when preparing to update goals
 - Found that fewer than half of programs were meeting targets, although not losing ground either
- 2030 targets will be a bit more achievable based on historic program performance

Exam Completion	68% (-20%)	88%
Treatment Initiation	80% (-7%)	87%
Treatment Completion	92% <mark>(+5%)</mark>	87%



Program Evaluation Plan 2025-2030



2025-2030 Planned Projects

- Building on the workload evaluation from the previous five-year grant cycle
 - Evaluation of internal reporting of clients with presumptive TB, for whom TB is later ruled out. Management of clients for whom TB is ruled out is staffing intensive and this information is critical for informing staffing decisions
- Evaluation of NTIP indicator for culture turnaround time and NAAT turnaround time
- Evaluation of EDN data reporting completeness including evaluation of LTBI treatment initiation and completion of immigrants and refugees with a B1 classification.
- Evaluation of training with infection control partners across Virginia



2025 Project: Culture and NAAT Turnaround Time (TAT) for Positive Respiratory Specimens

Summary

Virginia struggles to meet national targets for laboratory reporting in culture and NAAT TAT. Timely TAT and reporting are essential to TB case management.

Purpose


To determine if performance is impacted by:

- Inaccurate data entry
- External labs vs. DCLS

Determine if goals are achievable in Virginia based on defined processes for labs in Virginia




TAT – Culture – 2025 Target - 78%





TAT – NAA – 2025 Target - 97%





Timeline

- January 2025 Identify surveillance records for patients who did not meet goal for 2022 or 2023
 - Perform QA to ensure accurate and correct data captured in VEDSS
- March 2025 Determine if there is a difference in timeliness for specimens tested at DCLS compared to external labs
 - Reminder that NTIP metrics are based on a single result
- May 2025 Determine if NTIP objectives are achievable based on defined processes for labs in Virginia
 - Outreach to labs about TB testing processes



Cohort Review

- Annual cohort reviews for any district in which at least one countable case was reported and/or in which at least one B1 client was evaluated in the prior year.
 - Focus on applicable NTIP
 - Review district-level NTIP indicator goal performance and share best practices
 - Clarify surveillance definitions; ensure data is captured appropriately
 - Conversational and reflective
- Learning from others:
 - Two webinars per year highlighting a complicated or challenging case or to share best practices.



EDN Quarterly Reports

- Quarterly EDN reports for any district with at least one refugee or immigrant with a B status
 - Looking at the worksheet status
 - Sending reports to districts that have any status of "not started" for the previous quarter or prior to that quarter
 - Sending requests for updates for any status of "in progress" that is over 6 months old
 - Asking for updates
