Mission and Overview

Virginia Department of Health Mission Statement:

To protect the health and promote the well-being of all people in Virginia.

The goal of the 21 Day Health Equity Challenge is to expand our understanding of experiences and identities different from our own so that we may foster awareness, understanding, and collective action toward eliminating health disparities.

For 21 days, participants are asked to read, watch, or listen to one new resource each day that examines the history of inequities in the US.

There will be opportunities to reflect individually and in group discussions that will be offered through email and conference call throughout the challenge. Participation is voluntary. Challenge yourself to learn something new and share what you learn with others.

- 1. Reflect on what you would like to learn over the 21 days.
- 2. Choose a resource for each day and record it in your daily tracker. You are encouraged to choose from a variety of topic areas and can also choose to follow prompts from email updates that will allow you to best engage in the weekly reflection discussion.
- 3. Share your thoughts on what you watch/listen to/read in the weekly discussion and/or in this document.
- 4. Expand your learning by talking with other about what you've learned and continue to seek out conversations about diversity, equity, and inclusion.
