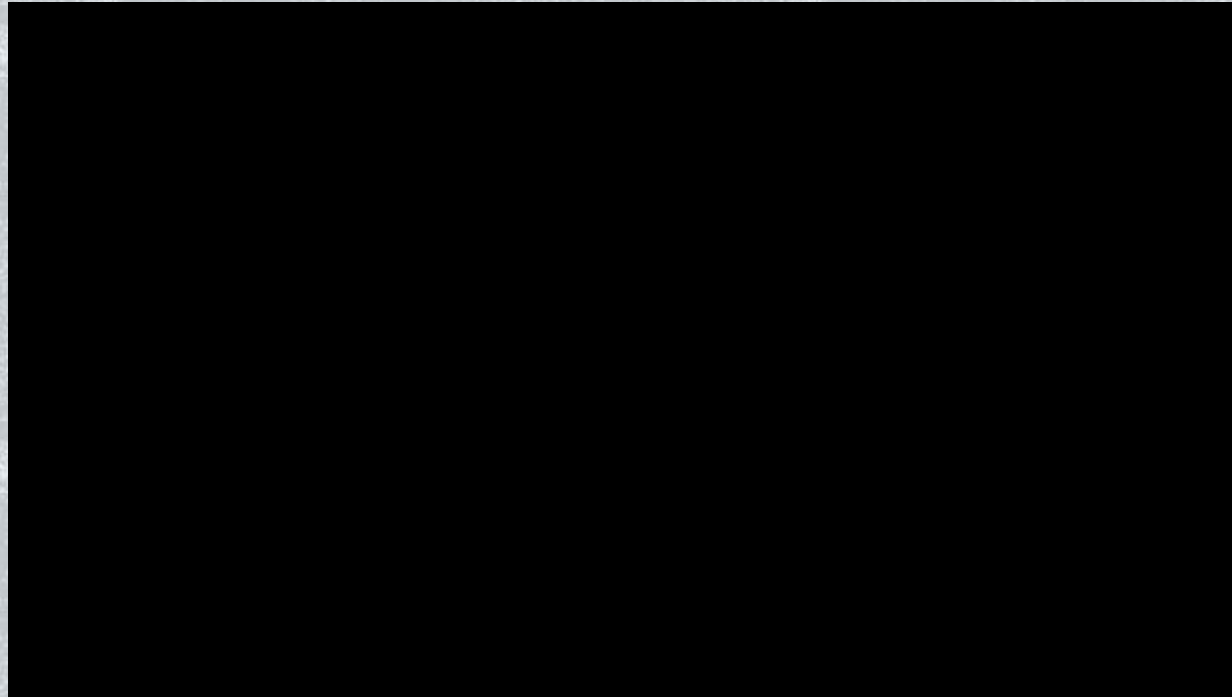
# Health equity means

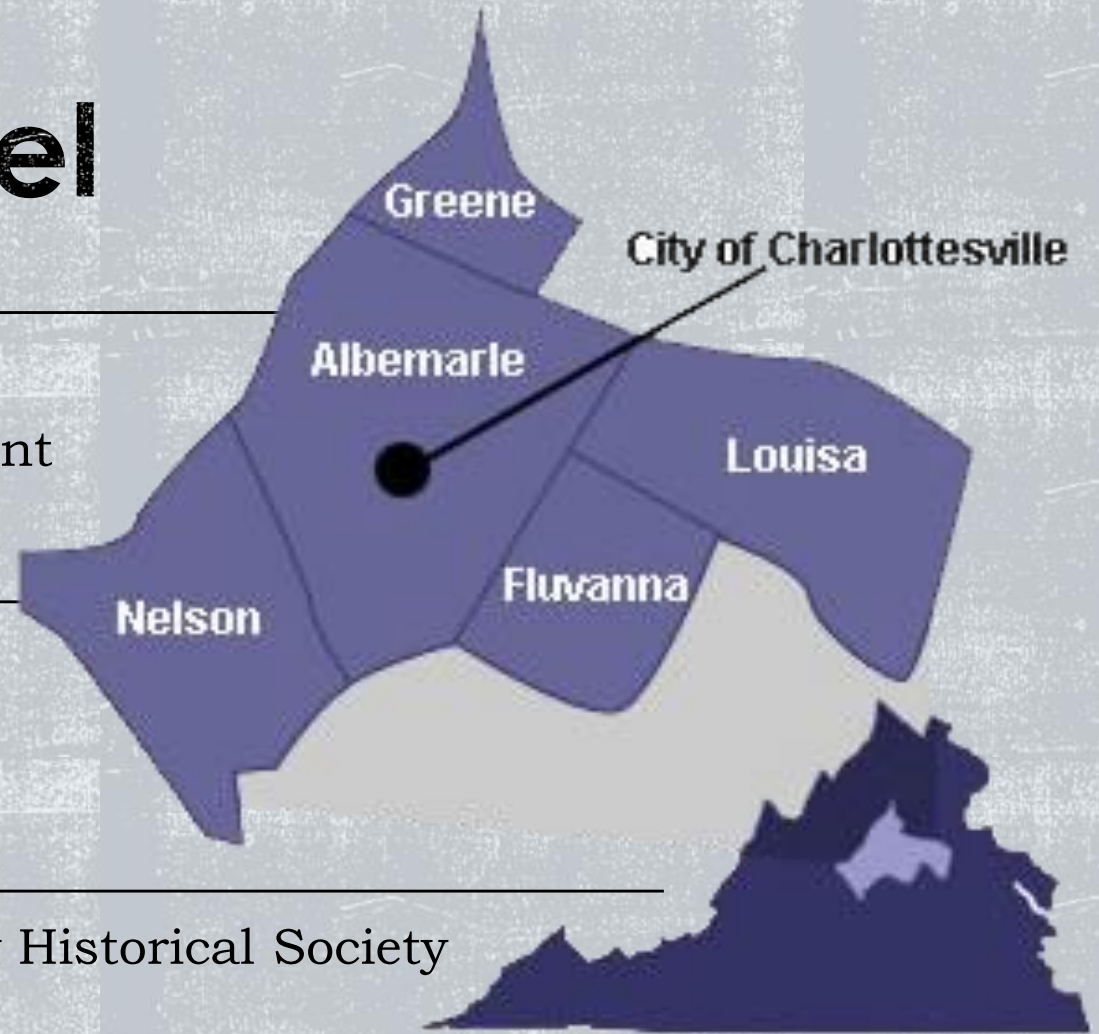
