- Many low-income and uninsured community members confront challenges when seeking health services

Areas of Focus

- Need for revisions to local health governing board's policies
- Lack of streamlined referral system
- Financial barriers to specialty care for uninsured patients

Initiatives

Proposed Revisions to Local Board's Policies

- Reviewed state government's 2024 changes to Virginia Freedom of Information Act
- Proposed revisions to Health Care Advisory Board's policies to ensure compliance with the law
- Delivered presentation and took questions from county health leaders

Researched Industry Trends

Economic benefits of free HIV/STI testing

- Analyzed data on costs saved from testing and treatment
- Presented findings to health department leaders

CMS final rule on minimum staffing standards

- Summarized 125-page final rule
- Delivered report to county workgroup

Advanced Affordable Housing in Zoning Process

- Analyzed historical development proposals
- Collected data on community need for continuing care communities, requirements for affordable units
- Wrote proposal to Board of Supervisors on behalf of Health Care Advisory Board recommending zoning approval for medical facility

Collected Data for Referral Platform Implementation

- Developed survey for health department program managers about their referral processes
- Identified critical data to collect during in-depth conversations
- Facilitated interviews with health department employees, documented findings in Excel

Supplemental Experiences

- Toured county **health center** and shadowed physician
- Worked across the health department
 - Epidemiology training; meetings with health equity team, outreach team; allstaff discussion with health director
 - Informational interviews with employees in IT, maternal health, Office of Innovation + more
- Met with community partners: Emergency Food Strategy Team, Neighborhood Health, HealthWorks + more
