Alzheimer's and Brain Awareness



June Is Alzheimer's & Brain Awareness Month! According to the Alzheimer's Association, more than 55 million people are living with Alzheimer's or another dementia worldwide.

Alzheimer's disease is a brain disorder that slowly destroys memory and thinking skills, and eventually, the ability to carry out the simplest tasks. In most people with Alzheimer's, symptoms first appear later in life. Estimates vary, but experts suggest that more than 6 million Americans, most of them age 65 or older, may have Alzheimer's. Dementia is the loss of cognitive functioning — thinking, remembering, and reasoning — and behavioral abilities to such an extent that it interferes with a person's daily life and activities. Dementia ranges in severity from the mildest stage, when it is just beginning to affect a person's functioning, to the most severe stage, when the person must depend completely on others for help with basic activities of daily living.

It works to decrease infant mortality, maternal mortality, premature birth, low birth weight and delay of a second pregnancy. Water Testing & Wastewater Professionals Day

About 1.6 million people or 22% of Virginians, rely on wells, 2024 Drinking Water Clinics springs, or cisterns. The objective for the Virginia Household Water Quality Programs (VAHWQP) is to improve water quality and health in Virginians using private water supplies. Well water should be tested every year for total coliform bacteria. Every three years the pH and total dissolved solids should be tested. Drinking water clinics are offered in the district through a partnership with the Virginia Cooperative Extension. The clinics provide affordable water testing, interpretation of test results and information about maintenance of private water systems and dealing with water problems.
