# Virginia Medevac Best Practice

Date Reviewed: July 13, 2006

**Target Audience:** Flight Comm. Centers, Public Safety Comm. Centers, Local Fire and Rescue

Departments, Regional Councils, Hospital ED's

Area: Communications & Multiple Aircraft Response

## **Best Practice:**

During multiple aircraft requests to a facility or a scene incident, all responding aircraft shall be notified that there will be multiple aircraft responding to the same location.

### Goal:

To ensure the safety of all responding personnel, ground or flight.

### **Procedure:**

- 1. After a communications center is notified that another aircraft has been requested to the facility or scene, the following is the recommended process for notification:
  - a. The <u>requesting</u> communication center contacts all other responding aircraft communication centers and advises them of the multiple aircraft response.
  - b. Communication centers shall inform their prospective aircraft of multiple helicopters responding. Information relayed to the flight crews should include;
    - i. Number of inbound aircraft
    - ii. Assisting aircraft name (i.e. LifeFlight 6)
- 2. During landing zone operations, all aircraft-ground communications shall occur on a common assigned incident radio frequency.
- 3. Alternate radio communications, between aircraft, may be accomplished using 123.05.

#### **Education:**

All flight programs licensed in the Commonwealth of Virginia, should educate EMS and hospital personnel of this recommendation.
