| V. Special Presentation | a. Blood Products and Identifying Jehovah's Witnesses – Mr. Darrel Johnson Jehovah's Witnesses do not accept transfusions, whole blood, or blood products. This is a deeply held religious belief. How do EMS providers identify them? One of the ways is through their Advanced Medical Directive or Durable Do Not Resuscitate documents. Many of them wear medical ID bracelets or keychains. Dr. Brand stated that they have it in their protocols to look for a medical ID bracelet. Dr. Yee also stated that other programs have it in their protocols as well. | |

| | The committee discussed the need for CSRs and drug storage. They also discussed the meaning of "responsible party" as it pertains to stocking/restocking the drug box and administering drugs. For clarification, the | |
| | "supervising practitioner" is the Medical Director, the responsible party will be a certified EMS provider at a minimum, and the person who has access to a closed kit can be any member of the organization. The discussion then continued to drug deliveries by UPS or FedEx and who would be there to secure the drugs. Clarification was | |
| | needed on what an EMS vehicle is according to the BOP. OEMS refers to an EMS-licensed vehicle. Dr. Yee read the DEA's definition of an EMS vehicle. Can drugs be transported in non-licensed vehicles? The language needs to be cleaned up. For clarification, the "ultimate user" is the patient. An automated dispensing device (ADD) does not need a separate CSR. Multiple automated dispensing devices can go under the same CSR. Per Caroline, | |

| | An EMS Regional Council can hold a CSR, and the agencies under that Council can utilize that CSR. Can Virginia exempt Schedule 6 medications (IV Fluids) from the CSR requirement? Per Caroline, IV Fluids are included in the CSR. The committee discussed the costs of purchasing locking mechanisms and the use of alarms. Bubby Bish spoke on behalf of the volunteer agencies that are going to do BLS only due to the financial burden this has on the small agencies. There are about 20 Federal EMS agencies, and they are not subject to BOP regulations, only DEA. | |
| | FDA's Drug Supply Chain Security Act of 2013 Track and trace of medication affects pharmacists and hospitals. Is the transfer of medication allowed for EMS under DSCSA? Yes. Enforcement begins November 27, 2024. What are the hospital system requirements under DSCSA? The committee discussed this as well as one-to-one exchanges. What are the record-keeping methods for EMS agencies? Per Dr. Yee, we must keep records of purchases, usage, and disposal. As for purchasing, where can EMS agencies purchase medicines? Bound Tree is a vendor that many agencies purchase from. Can EMS agencies purchase from the VHHA contract? Matthew Marry has a long-standing contract with Vizient. Regional EMS Councils and hospitals across the commonwealth can utilize this contract. They are working on simplifying the process for EMS agency use. Dr. Brand stated that he has started to see an opportunity for regionalization within all the parts and pieces of this. The committee discussed the possibility of the EMS Regional Councils being able to hold the CSR and transfer the drugs/medications to the EMS agencies in their regions. | |
| | Protecting Patient Access to Emergency Medications Act of 2017 Schedule 2-5 medications are used for pain management. DEA registrations/licenses are required, and the CSR will be needed first. The timeline is approximately two months to get the CSR and then another three to four months for the DEA license. We will be cutting it close to the November enforcement date. There is a May 2 BOP Regulations meeting per Caroline and we should wait until after that to have clear direction/guidelines. It will tell us who needs CSRs, under what circumstances if any, whether an alarm is required, etc. Mr. Hoover, of the audience, stated that he is unsure of what to tell his staff. He hasn't learned a thing at this meeting. Everyone was strongly encouraged to work with their Regional Councils. A motion was made by Dr. Louka to have VFCA lead the liaison agencies, hospitals, pharmacies, regional councils, etc. The motion was seconded by Dr. Martin. All committee members were in favor of the motion. The motion carried. A workgroup has already been formed in which Chief Michael Player is the lead. VFCA will attend the next workgroup meeting. | |

Background

The Virginia EMS Scholarship Program is managed by the Virginia Office of Emergency Medical Services providing scholarship awards to current Virginia EMS Providers and those seeking to become EMS providers in the Commonwealth.

The scholarship program supports students who are accepted into an eligible Virginia approved initial certification program–EMR, EMT, Advanced EMT and Paramedic.


The scholarship program is not designed to provide 100% funding for a training program.

FY24 Scholarship Budget

The FY24 budget for the Virginia EMS Scholarship Program is \$1,300,000.00. The following chart shows a breakdown of funding based on three (3) categories:


- 1) Applications Pending Approval

 Virginia EMS Scholarship module is new, OEMS staff have only approved a small group of
 test applications as we work through the payment processes with the VDH Office of Financial
 Management.
- **Remaining Funds** this category is the total dollar value of funds remaining in the scholarship program and available for to students for the remainder of the fiscal year.





Breakdown of Pending Applications



Total # of Pending Applicants by Level




