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| V. Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) & Board of Pharmacy (BOP) Compliance Issues | AMIR Louka discussed FDA letter: Apparently there is no problem with VA EMS Drug system according to a letter from the DEA. George Lindbeck thinks that the letter referenced from the DEA might not really mean what it says, he also points out that the Hospitals are likely done with the Drug Box Programs.  Dr. Louka asked what the effort is to move the "artificial" deadline out to a more realistic timeline. What is OEMS doing to help agencies with this effort? There was no response from any OEMS official in the room.  Dr. Reed asked for a unified response from OEMS on extending the "deadline" for drug box change over. Mr. Passmore said that OEMS did advocate to maintain the Drug Box system – he says that he cannot really do anything.  Dr. Turnbill asked for a letter from OEMS supporting Drug Box changeover deadline delays. Mr. Passmore said that because of the climate in OEMS he cannot do anything. He pointed out that grants are available through RSAF.  Michael Player spoke at the podium to give an update on Peninsula's EMS Council effort and referred to letters between congressional representative the DEA and FDA. He is asking for an effort to move the deadline forward.  • Dr. Morgan asked for help from the State's Executive Branch on this issue.  • Dr. Louka pointed out that Southwest Virginia is in a very bad position given a hurricane related emergency to deal with replacing the drug box system.  • Ron Passmore suggested that the Governor might not have the authority to address this issue. And added that Southwest Virginia does not rely on Hospital Drug Boxes.  • Chief Ferguson asked again for help form OEMS in terms of a letter or help on pushing the deadline out. | Dr. Louka to write a letter.                                |  |
