We are at the "IN-Betweens" Still a month remaining in the Atlantic Hurricane Season; and beginning to see advancing cooler weather and the promise of Winter. ICS-400 provides training and resources for responders who require advanced application of the ICS by providing overall incident management skills rather than tactical expertise. Expanding upon information covered in ICS-100 through ICS-300 courses, ICS-400 emphasizes large-scale organizational development, roles and relationships of the command and general staff, and planning, operational, logistical, and fiscal considerations related to large and complex incident and event management. The course also describes the application of Area Command and the importance of interagency coordination on complex incidents and events.

The Eight Step Exercise Design Process.... Step 6: Write Major and detailed Events

Now we start to put context in our exercise by writing the major and detailed events that relate to the threat or hazard we have chosen for our scenario or narrative. For example, if we chose a hurricane, the storm itself could be a major event, but what else is associates with a hurricane? There is rain which is a detailed event, but how much rain? If you say 24-36 inches of rain, this is an even better example of a detailed event. What else? There could be tornadoes, another major event. What other detailed events might go with a tornado threat? A tornado watch? tornado warning? Step 8:

Reports of tornadoes on the ground? These are all examples of events. They could be used as a major or minor event depending on the scope of the exercise and the objective you want to achieve. You can use these events as a way of driving players to achieve those

objectives developed early on in the planning process.

It time exercise design will become second

nature as you go through the process practicing exercise development. Remember. you are not alone in this effort. Work with your planning team members to generate ideas and to make a more robust exercise. Own the process!

In Other Exercise News...

As you may be aware, an ongoing requirement for the new grant cycle is the development of a Multi-Year Training and Exercise Plan. This plan is now called the Integrated and Exercise Plan. This plan is now called the Integrated Preparedness Plan (IPP). We held the Integrated Preparedness Planning Workshop (IPPW) in August with our partners from VDEM, VHHA, Coalitions, DCLS, and VDH Offices.

The plan is in development and will be released agency wide upon its completion. The key tenants of the plan includes our Hazard Vulnerability Analysis, Grant Requirements, Exercise requirements for the nest 5-year budget period and calendar of execution of the plan for training and exercises.

The plan is developed for the five-year period but reviewed annually for updates.

New MRC HIPAA Training Course Replaces Requirement for Cybersecurity/HIPAA Training for MRC Volunteers

In October, a new training HIPAA-ONLY course was launched on TRAIN. MRC Volunteers that have already completed the previous Cybersecurity/HIPAA training course do not need to take this new HIPAA course. As of October 10, 2024, about 17% of Virginia MRC Volunteers have completed the training requirement and we

need to increase this number. Therefore, if MRC Volunteers have not completed the previous course, they need to take the new HIPAA-ONLY course.

Further, MRC Volunteers that have not completed HIPAA training will be "conditionally deployable" which means that they can only be deployed in one the following circumstances:

- The volunteer will be able to complete the
- HIPAA training at the beginning of their deployment.
- The volunteer will be deployed for a mission that has zero exposure to HIPAA-protected information (as approved by the Health District Director)
- The deployment is in response to a declared emergency and the Health District director has waived the requirement for HIPAA training for volunteers.
